Quinnipiac Park provides direct access to the Quinnipiac River via a forested trail located behind the soccer fields. Common wildlife found along the Quinnipiac River include: owl, raccoon, deer, mink, yellow shafted flicker and kingfisher.

Trees found in the 30-acre wooded forest of Quinnipiac Park include beech, eastern hemlock, red and white oak, and quaking aspen. The river banks are populated by tree species that have adapted to the seasonal flooding, such as; red and green ash, American sycamore, silver maple, and slippery elm.

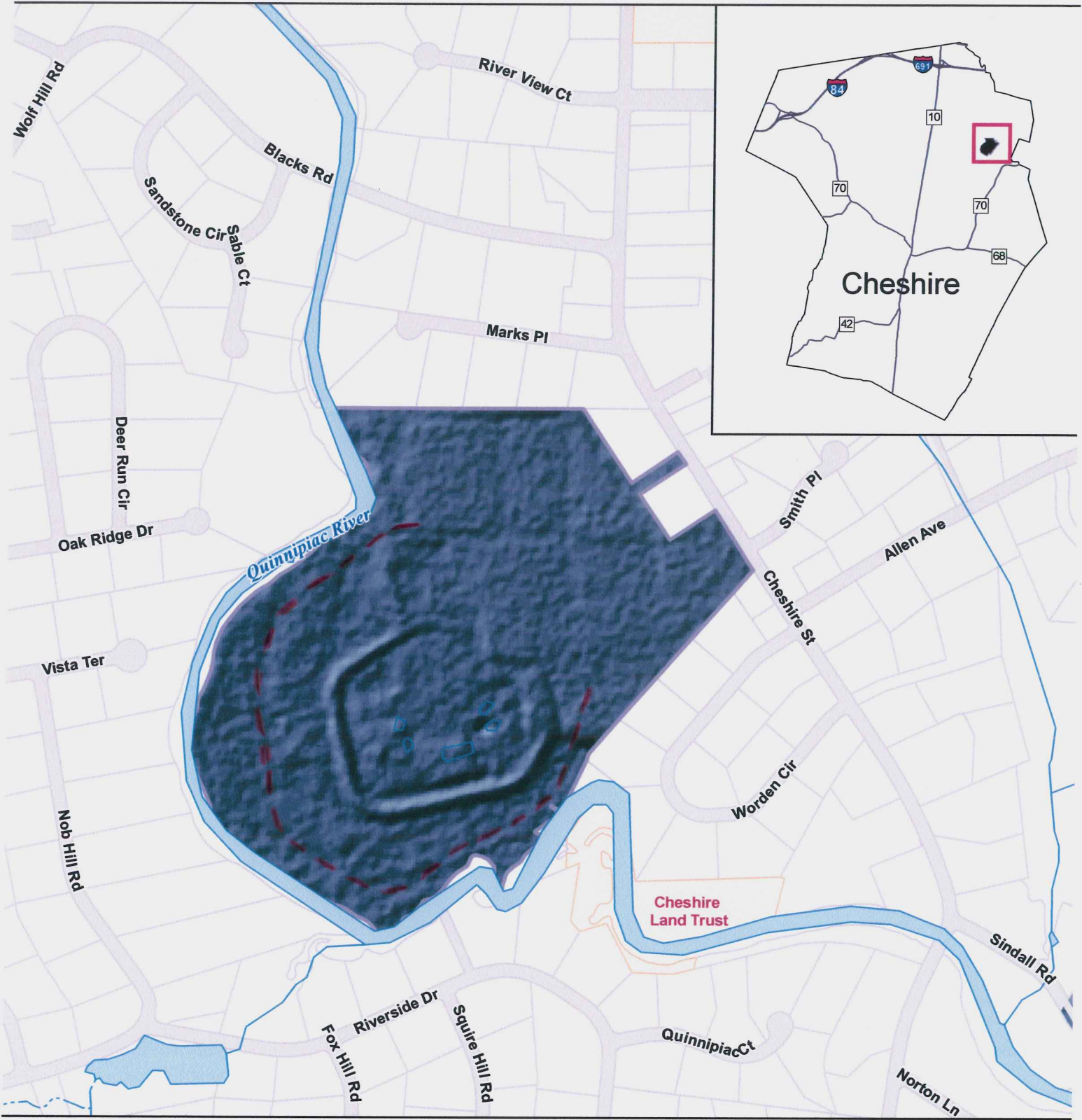

# Quinnipiac Park River Walk Map

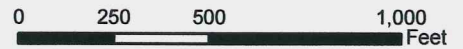


# Quinnipiac Park Cheshire, Connecticut
