Burglary – Detectives received two additional burglaries in the month of May, and assisted Patrol Division on another. Detectives are actively investigating a recent burglary to a local business in the West end of Cheshire, and a residential burglary in the South end. Detectives, working with several units of the Patrol Division, assisted in making an arrest on a residential burglary. After officers received information from the complainant that their residence was recently burglarized officers responded to the location to start an investigation. A Public Works employee contacted dispatch when the suspect was observed walking down an adjacent street. Officers responded to that location and an arrest was made.

Check Cases – Detectives completed their investigation of a fraud case involving a local business and an ex employee. The suspect is accused of stealing checks and misuse of a credit card from a former employer. A warrant was applied for, signed by the courts, and will be served in the near future.

Larceny – The Detective Division continues its investigation involving an embezzlement of over \$200,000 from a local business. Detectives are working closely with local and state prosecutors during the investigation. There was another case involving a theft from motor vehicle. The victim left their vehicle doors unlocked, and their valuables in plain sight within the vehicle. **The Cheshire Police Department would like to remind all residents to lock your vehicles when parking them, and conceal or secure all valuables. This pertains to your residential driveway also.**

Narcotics – Detectives continue to gather information on existing investigations, as well as work closely with local and state agencies on regional cases.

Sexual Assault – Detectives received three new sexual assault cases. Due to the sensitive nature of these cases no additional information will be disclosed.

Missing Persons – No new missing person cases were reported for the month of May.

Other – Detectives investigated one untimely death, but due to the sensitive nature of the case no additional information will be released. Detectives continue to receive training and attend regional meetings with other agencies. One detective completed their week long recertification training in Meriden.

Training and Other

During the month of March, all officers assigned to the Traffic Division, attended a one day seminar at Central Connecticut State University for Child Passenger Safety issues.

Officer Schechter attended one week mandatory recertification training at the Meriden Police Department, and a one day course on Use of Force issues at the Meriden Police Academy.

Officers Schechter and Jester both conducted firearms training as well as SRT training.

The Traffic Division, along with members of Patrol, conducted several State of Connecticut/federal sponsored enforcement activities during May.

Officers participated in the **Click It or Ticket** campaign with brings attention to seatbelt violations. Officers conducted checkpoints on May 23rd and June 1st. A total of seventy (70) infractions were issued for Failure to Wear a Seatbelt. Pre enforcement and post enforcement surveys were conducted to gauge seatbelt usage.

The pre-enforcement survey found an **85%** compliance rate.
The post-enforcement survey found an **87%** compliance rate.

DUI roving patrols and a Sobriety Checkpoint were conducted during the month of May. These enforcement activities resulted in several DUI, alcohol, or drug related arrests.
