**Parking Bans** - Vehicle owners are reminded that, during the time of falling snow, sleet or freezing rain, no vehicle may be left standing or parked on any highway within the Town, or on Town-owned or operated property, in such a manner as to constitute a menace to traffic or be an obstacle to the convenient clearing, removal or plowing of snow or the sanding of ice. Per Town Ordinance 15-4, violators will be fined \$25.00 and vehicles may be towed at the owner's expense.

**Speed Monitors** - The Cheshire Police Department receives an ever-increasing number of complaints regarding speeding vehicles in our community. To assist with traffic calming and neighborhood traffic management, the Traffic Division maintains and deploys two radar trailers and two radar speed signs. These radar controlled display units provide continuous speed monitoring and alert motorists of how fast they are driving. These devices have been proven to slow traffic, making our streets and neighborhoods safer. # DETECTIVE DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT

**February 2010**

The following is a brief summary of cases investigated during the month of February.

**Arson-** Detectives are still investigating a possible arson of a motor vehicle on Sindal Rd. The case is being investigated in conjunction with the Fire Marshall's office.

**Burglaries-** Detectives are received two new Burglary cases in the month of February. One was a residential burglary on South Main St and the other a residential burglary on Brentwood Drive. The target was jewelry. These cases are currently under investigation.

**Criminal Mischief-** Detectives are investigating a criminal mischief complaint at a local business. The case involves damage from a previous tenant.

**Death Investigation:** Detectives are investigating two untimely deaths in the month of January. A 21 year old female was found deceased at her residence. There is no foul play and the manner of death is ruled accidental. No further information will be given to respect the family and deceased.

**FRAUD-** Detectives are currently investigating two fraud cases involving the forged checks. These cases involve several thousands of dollars in losses. Detectives are following leads in a case where several people passed bad checks at a local bank.

**Juvenile Cases-** The youth officer and the SRO have investigated several minor juvenile complaints.

**Larcenies-** Detectives are investigating a rash of thefts from motor vehicles in town. Warrants have been signed for several suspects in these cases and are currently being sought for arrest. The cases involved recent vehicle break-in's over the past several months. Detectives are currently investigating a larceny case involving the theft of jewelry from a residence. Detectives are investigating the theft of silverware from a residence. The case is still under investigation.

**Narcotic Investigations-** Detectives are investigating several new cases involving the sale of narcotics in the town of Cheshire. Due to the sensitive nature of these investigations, no further information will be released as to protect the integrity of these cases. Detectives have secured an arrest warrant for a suspect in a narcotic case involving possession of narcotics. The warrant will be attempted to be served shortly.

**Pistol Permits/Employment Investigations-** Crime Prevention investigated 10 pistol permit applications during the month of February.

**Sexual Assault-** Detectives are investigating the report of two new sexual assault complaints. Due to the sensitive nature of the complaints, no further information will be released to protect the identity of the victims and witnesses.

**Other investigations-** The SRO investigated several residency issues in regards to student's residency locations.
