

REQUEST FOR DETERMINATION
BROAD BROOK / SOUTH SELECTIVE TIMBER HARVEST
CUTTING SCHEDULE / SEDIMENTATION AND EROSION CONTROL PLAN

Scotland Hardwoods (A Rossi Company) plans to conduct a logging operation on approximately 65 of 380.7 total acres owned by the City Of Meriden. This land is further identified by the Cheshire Assessors Map #61 and Lot #9. A one to three man logging crew operating a log skidder will cut and skid the logs to one main yarding area located off Wallingford Road. From this yarding area a tri-axle log truck will pick up the logs and exit the property via Wallingford Road. Regular working hours are from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM Monday thru Saturday. The property boundaries have been marked with fluorescent pink flagging and the main skid roads have been identified with blue. Before the harvest starts all of the trees to be harvested will be marked with orange or blue paint about 4 feet above the ground and at the base of each stump. It is estimated that about one hundred and fifty thousand board feet of sawtimber will be harvested from the property. Concerning the harvest area approximately 90% of the White Ash trees will be removed as most of these trees are dead or dying due to an insect called the Emerald Ash Borer. Of the remaining trees, about 40% of the trees 14 inches D.B.H. (diameter at breast height) and larger, will be removed. Oak, White Ash, Black Birch, Maple, Hickory and Tulip Poplar represent the species of trees involved with the harvest. Any portion of the tops, concerning the harvested trees, not removed from the property will be reduced to within five feet of the ground level. It is estimated that about six to eight weeks will be required to complete the project. We hope to start the harvest during the fall of 2021.

No drainages will have to be crossed concerning this project. Upon completion of the harvest the main skid trails will be back bladed level and water bars will be installed where necessary. A stone tracking pad will be put in place as related to the yarding area where the log trucks be coming off the property on to Wallingford Road. 

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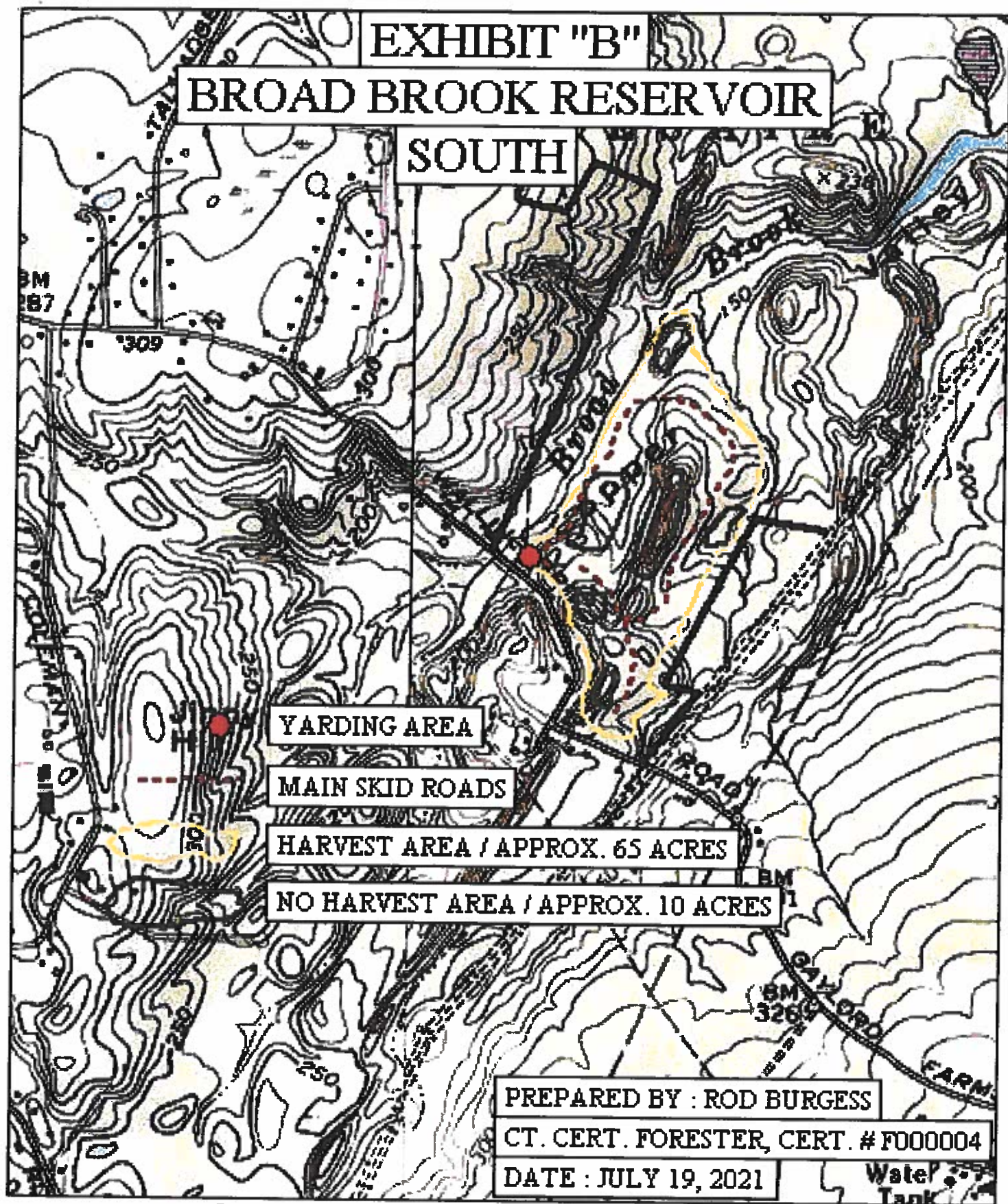
