Pick up your meal at Cheshire Senior Center on Wednesdays from 11am-12pm. You can order weekly or monthly and as many meals as you would like.

How can I get started?

You will get an automatic reply to your email, as confirmation that the email was received, but if you call, there will not be a return call, if you call and leave a message with your order.

Let us know your menu selection for the week or month. Pay with a credit card, Venmo or check and never worry about cooking again! All Meals must be paid in advance. Please call the Cheshire Senior Center with any questions.

Does Medicaid Pay for Assisted Living?

What is assisted living?

Assisted living is a home-like residential community for older adults. Residents typically live in a room or apartment but have access to shared living spaces and on-site social activities. Meals, housekeeping, laundry, and transportation are usually included in assisted living costs. In addition, trained staff is on hand 24 hours a day to help residents with personal care tasks such as bathing, dressing, toileting, and managing their medications.

Does Medicaid cover assisted living expenses?

Medicaid does not cover the room and board part of assisted living costs. However, many states offer Medicaid waiver programs that can help defray the costs of assisted living. These are called Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Medicaid waivers or 1915(c) Medicaid waivers. Medicaid waivers are designed to prevent or delay the move into a nursing home. They help cover some long-term services and supports for older adults, people with disabilities, and people with dementia. These services can be provided in a variety of settings, from adult day care centers to assisted living facilities. Nearly 1 in 6 assisted living residents depends on Medicaid to pay for daily care services.

Assisted living for dementia and Medicaid

Some Medicaid assisted living waivers include memory care (or dementia care). Memory care facilities offer long-term residential support specially tailored to people who have cognitive and memory challenges. By covering some costs related to memory care, Medicaid assisted living waivers can help people with Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia live independently for longer and enjoy a better quality of life.

Finding assisted living facilities that accept Medicaid

Not all assisted living facilities accept Medicaid, and those that do may only allow a certain number of beds for people on Medicaid. In some cases, a facility may not accept Medicaid but they may permit outside service providers to come in and provide support for Medicaidfunded residents.

To find assisted living facilities near you that work with older adults on Medicaid, reach out to your local area agency on aging or senior center. They may be able to refer you to Medicaid-approved residences nearby.

BRING ME BACK HOME REGISTRY

What is the Bring Me Back Home Program?

Bring Me Back Home (BMBH) is a new registry for Connecticut residents which allows law enforcement access to information to assist in the recovery of missing or wandering persons. The provided information and photo, accessible through the COLLECT criminal justice and safety system, helps first responders and families reunite with individuals living with cognitive challenges, such as dementia or autism. This information is confidential and secure and can only be accessed by law enforcement personnel in an emergency.

How can we register?

To sign your loved one up for Bring Me Back Home, visit ct.gov/BMBH or scan the QR code below.

How does Bring Me Back Home work?

A family member or guardian registers their person with cognitive challenges through the link above, or in person at your nearest police department. This information is then part of the statewide Bring Me Back Home registry. When the person wanders or is missing, individuals should call 9-1-1 IMMEDIATELY, and indicate that they are registered with the Bring Me Back Home program. Law enforcement officers will have access to the confidential and secure information and respond appropriately.

Who is eligible?

All members of the community whose cognitive challenges may lead to confusion and disorientation, and who are at risk of wandering or getting lost.

Why is this important?

Wandering can be dangerous and life threatening. If not found within 24 hours, there is a much higher probability individuals may suffer serious injury or death.

For example, according to the Alzheimer's Association, 6 in 10 people living with dementia will wander. Alzheimer's disease, and other forms of dementia, can cause people to lose their ability to recognize familiar places and faces. This can happen at any stage of the disease and at any time of the day or night, this risk weighs heavily on caregivers and family.

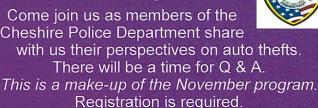
