MINUTES OF THE JOINT TOWN COUNCIL, PUBLIC BUILDING COMMISSION AND BOARD OF EDUCATION SITE VISIT, 7:00 P.M., WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 30, 2015 CHESHIRE HIGH SCHOOL LOCKER ROOM PROJECT 525 SOUTH MAIN STREET, CHESHIRE CT 06410

Chairman Slocum called the meeting to order at 7:05pm.

Vincent Masciana provided an overview of the project and the locker room accommodations and specifics. There are 86 full size lockers, a shower facility and bathroom (both ADA compliant), a coaches' room and a coaches' bathroom and shower (also ADA compliant). The cost of the project was slightly over \$800,000 and the Board of Education supplemented the capital appropriation. The facility still has a punch list of a few items and will then pursue the certificate of occupancy. The locker rooms will not be ready for use for at least one more week.

Mr. Masciana in response to questions from Councilwomen Linehan and Harris indicated that there are 86 full size lockers but depending upon the sport using the locker room that some teams would double up on locker space (i.e. lacrosse). Mr. Masciana also indicated that the total number of football participants at all levels, was 126 students, which was a response to Councilwoman Nichol's question.

Everyone received a full tour of the facility and at 7:35pm a motion to adjourn was made by Jim Sima and seconded by Peter Talbot. The vote was unanimous.
